

1. Dennis Bartolucci; age 73
2. I was born and raised in Connecticut. My wife and I purchased a house on Marco in 2011. Following retirement in 2013, we increasingly resided on Marco Island. By the time we became Florida voters in 2022, we had already been living “full time” on Marco for a while.
3. I have a BA in Political Science from the University of Connecticut and a Masters degree in Public Administration from the Maxwell School of Citizenship and Public Affairs at Syracuse University. I also have the equivalent college credits of an Accounting major, which qualified me to be a CPA.
4. Currently retired from PricewaterhouseCoopers where I worked for 32 years, 20 of which as a Partner with progressive management responsibilities. I practiced public accounting for twenty years, and consulting the last twelve years as a partner. I was a CPA, licensed in Massachusetts, Ohio and Illinois, until my retirement in 2013. Prior to working at PwC, I worked for the Public Utility Regulatory Commission in Connecticut for 4 years performing management audits of electric, gas, telephone and water utilities with progressive responsibility. I became the most senior person performing this work.
5. My only public sector work was with the utility commission and the occasional public sector assignments I had in my PwC career.
6. As a retired CPA, I tend to focus on money. Money is needed for everything we do as a city. Some of our

issues will require a great deal of money. We need to diversify our city revenue. Our major source of revenue, and the only one we really control, is the property tax. The residential properties pay 96% of this. Tourists contribute zero to the city treasury directly and very little indirectly, yet a significant portion our city costs are for supporting and hosting tourists.

We also need leadership that is a better steward of our money. I am a fiscal conservative. Dennis4Marco.com has more information. We need people with real skills and experience, not just narrow local experience.

It comes down to: Who Do You Trust With Your Money?

Other top issues are restoring the health of our waterways and ending the noise that continues from short term rentals. Balancing the interests of Residents and Commercial investors is key.

7. I disagree that the City and the Council are free to violate our city Ordinances. There are multiple instances of the Council willfully violating law, and the City Attorney saying there are no penalties involved when the City and Council do so. This is the stuff of a Banana Republic. Two current candidates were involved in one of these instances. I also disagreed when the current Council voted to raise taxes in September 2025 to pay for a “fake emergency” that the

city manager declared. This situation was proven as fake by a vote of the Council in September 2026.

The Council, under threat of a citizen lead referendum, agreed to pursue an Advanced Wastewater Treatment solution to mitigate the substantial pollution being dumped on our island by the reckless discharge of over 10 billion gallons of partially treated sewage liquid (called “reuse water”). This reuse water contains high concentrations of Nitrogen and Phosphorus, which seep into our waterways and over time have destroyed more and more of the Marco waterways. We need to ensure this solution is implemented, and it is a top goal of mine.
