

Who's Running for Florida Senate District 28 in the 2026 General Election

Florida Senate District 28 is on the Nov. 3, 2026, ballot for registered voters in the district. Republican Lauren Melo and Democrat David Silverberg are running for the open seat, vacated by term-limited Senate President Kathleen Passidomo, R-Naples. The winner will serve a four-year term in the Florida Senate.

Lauren Melo

Republican candidate Lauren Melo is running for the open Senate seat. She was born Aug. 30, 1966, in Naples, FL, and lives there with her husband, Robert, and their three children. In 1991 she started a trucking company that grew from a single truck into a fleet of more than 100, and she still holds a commercial driver's license. She has worked in real estate since 2009 and has been a broker at Florida's Realty Specialists since 2011.

Melo was first elected to the Florida House in 2020, representing District 80, and was elected to District 82 in 2022 following redistricting; she was reelected in 2024. This is her third House term; Florida's eight-year, four-term House limit would have allowed her to seek a fourth term in 2026, but she is running for the Senate seat instead. She chairs the House Human Services Subcommittee and was the lead legislative sponsor of the Right to Hunt and Fish constitutional amendment placed on the 2024 statewide ballot. Melo has served as president of the Naples Area Board of Realtors and the Naples Seahorse Riding Club, as a Guardian ad Litem volunteer, and on the boards of the Florida

Association of Realtors, the National Association of Realtors, HELP (Housing, Education, Lending, Programs), the Southwest Florida Truckers Association, and CareerSource Florida. ([VoteSmart](#); [Florida House of Representatives](#); [Ballotpedia](#); [Florida Politics](#))

Platform

Melo's campaign website is a single homepage without a dedicated Issues or Platform page. Its only stated platform language reads: "Lauren Melo is a conservative Republican who fights to protect our second amendment rights, honor our veterans, cut bureaucratic red tape, and grow the economy." The Florida Politics coverage of her endorsements adds detail on her legislative record: she focused on workforce development and workforce education since entering the House in 2020, and "concentrated heavily on addressing affordable housing challenges in the state." Accepting the Florida Chamber of Commerce's endorsement, she said: "Florida businesses are the backbone of our economy... I will continue to fight for policies that enable businesses, workers and families to prosper." Accepting the Associated Industries of Florida endorsement, she said: "Americans continue to flee high-tax, heavily regulated states for the freedom and prosperity that Florida has to offer... As a State Senator, I will continue my strong record of fighting for freedoms and for the future of Florida." ([Florida Politics](#); [Florida Politics](#))

After moving to Southwest Florida in 2013, he founded the political blog The Paradise Progressive in 2018, which covers Southwest Florida politics. His prior political activity includes serving as communications director for David Holden's 2017-2018 campaign for Florida's 19th Congressional District, and authoring a 2021 resolution reaffirming Collier County's allegiance to the U.S. Constitution. Political committees may raise and spend money without limit to support or oppose candidates, but Florida law caps direct transfers from a committee to a candidate's own campaign account at \$3,000 per election, with the primary and general treated as separate elections. Lauren Melo's Contributions

Lauren Melo raised a total of \$263,575 (monetary contributions plus in-kind support) from 317 individual and institutional donors, 94 percent of whom were from Florida and 6 percent from out of state. Political committees gave \$109,000 of that total directly to her campaign account. Nearly all of her in-kind support, 94 percent of the \$18,630 total, came from Florida Republican Senatorial Campaign Committee, Inc., an affiliated party committee.

Separately, Friends of Lauren Melo PAC, a political committee she chairs, has raised \$1.4 million since its formation, of which \$726,860 remains available.

David Silverberg's Contributions

David Silverberg raised a total of \$7,677 from 51 donors, 78 percent of whom were from Florida and 22 percent from out of state. He received no contributions from political committees and has no affiliated committee.
